BUDGET WIN FOR WESTERN NSW

In the 2020-21 NSW Budget, Western NSW will receive funding boosts for hospitals and schools.

Key highlights from the Budget for Central West and Orana include:

HEALTH

- **\$27.5 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$241.3 million project) for the Dubbo Hospital Redevelopment (Stages 1 to 4);
- **\$20.4 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$35 million project) for the Western Cancer Centre in Dubbo (State and Federal funded);
- **\$10.5 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$30 million project) for the commencement of the Dubbo Hospital Car Park;
- **\$7.5 million** for the establishment of a drug and alcohol rehabilitation centre in Dubbo to treat people that have become dependent upon alcohol or drugs;
- **\$5.4 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$70.7 million project) for the demolition of existing buildings to complete the Mudgee Hospital Redevelopment;
- **\$4.0 million** in 2020-21 for a new MRI service at Bathurst Hospital; and
- **\$500,000** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$70.2 million project) for the commencement of the Cowra Hospital Redevelopment.

EDUCATION

• Major upgrades and refurbishments to schools including Bletchington Public School, Young High School including a new joint-use library and community facility, and Millthorpe Public School.

TRANSPORT

- **\$27.9 million** in 2020-21 to continue delivery of the Main Western Rail Line Capacity Enhancements;
- **\$23.5 million** in 2020-21 to continue construction of the Great Western Highway upgrade between Kelso and Raglan;
- **\$20.5 million** in 2020-21 to continue planning of the new Dubbo Bridge (State and Federal funded);
- **\$15.3 million** in 2020-21 to continue planning for the Great Western Highway upgrade between Katoomba and Lithgow; and
- **\$5 million** in 2020-21 to continue planning for the Parkes Bypass on the Newell Highway (State and Federal funded).

PLANNING

• **\$14.4 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$18.0 million project) for the delivery of a pipeline to connect the augmented bore field to Condobolin;



- **\$8 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$10 million project) to plan and deliver a series of bores and a pipeline to increase water security for Cowra;
- **\$7.6 million** in 2020-21 (as part of \$19.9 million project) to complete the wholeof-Government office hub in Orange
- **\$6.6 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$8.8 million project) for a world-class Platypus Visitor and Education Facility at Taronga Western Plains Zoo;
- **\$4 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$5 million project) for the implementation of stormwater harvesting in Bathurst to supplement water supplies for the Bathurst Water Treatment Plant;
- **\$4 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$5 million project) for the delivery of a replacement pipeline from Winburndale Dam to the Bathurst Water Treatment Plant;
- **\$2 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$2.5 million project) for the delivery of a pipeline to connect the Spring Creek Dam to the Icely Road Water Treatment Plant;
- **\$2 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$2.5 million project) for the duplication of the Orange stormwater harvesting scheme;
- **\$1.5 million** in 2020-21 to deliver new and upgraded quality social and affordable housing for Aboriginal communities in Dubbo; and
- **\$1.3 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$3.7 million project) to upgrade Tyers Park Racecourse including additional stabling and a reconfiguration of the course.

REGIONAL NSW

- **\$7.3 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$8.5 million project) for the Jenolan Caves House Revitalisation Project;
- **\$4.1 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$10.1 million project) for the Condobolin Improved Freight Logistics & Visitor Information Centre Project;
- **\$4 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$10 million project) for the delivery of Stage 2 of the Glen Willow Regional Sports Complex;
- **\$3.7 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$10.1 million project) for the Destination Dubbo project;
- **\$2.5 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$25 million project) for the construction of the Orange Sports Complex;
- **\$1.4 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$2.9 million project) for the Bathurst Aerodrome upgrade; and
- **\$500,000** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$1.5 million project) for the Mudgee Cultural Precinct.

Key highlights from the Budget for Far West include:

HEALTH

- **\$1.1 million** in 2020-21 for the establishment of a mobile CT service for Cobar, Walgett and Bourke;
- **\$700,000** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$800,000 project) for the refurbishment of the Broken Hill Medical Imaging and Breastscreen Service;



• A trial of drinking water technologies to improve water security for Walgett and Lightning Ridge.

TRANSPORT

- **\$50 million** in 2020-21 for continued sealing of the Silver and Cobb Highways to provide all-weather and more durable highways in the region; and
- **\$4.2 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$17.1 million commitment) for the sealing of the Pooncarie Road in far west NSW.

PLANNING

- **\$1.8 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$6.5 million project) to deliver new and upgraded quality social and affordable housing for Aboriginal communities in Walgett, Wilcannia and Broken Hill;
- **\$1.2 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$4 million project) for the upgrade of the Line of Lode Crown Reserve.

REGIONAL NSW

- **\$4.2 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$8.4 million project) for the Wentworth Aerodrome;
- **\$4 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$5.2 million project) for the Sturt's Steps project;
- **\$1.9 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$2.4 million project) for the Broken Hill Airport safety upgrade;
- **\$1.2 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$3.5 million project) for the Baaka Cultural Centre in Wilcannia;
- **\$1.1 million** in 2020-21 (as part of a \$1.8 million project) for the Bourke Business District Regeneration; and
- An additional \$1 million (as part of a \$8.4 million project) to complete the new PCYC at Walgett that will include sports courts, a gymnastics centre, youth club and amenities.

STRONGER COMMUNITIES

• Redevelopment of the Broken Hill Police Station as part of a larger almost \$107.9 million multipurpose police station program.
